
Let's try to define leadership.

Growing Leaders (BRF, 2020)



James Lawrence focusses on the growth of Christian leaders, and how those leaders can help to grow other leaders.

As well as exploring the function of leadership, the position of the leader and the ability a leader needs (knowledge, skills and talents), he notes that God gives the gift of leadership, and God calls people to be leaders. (p.27-36)


He reflects on the special nature and distinctive nature of Christian leadership, and focusses on calling, character, leading well, and a leader's need for a deep relationship with God. (p. 36-47)


He begins his book with these statements (p.11-13):




'Character is foundational to everything. You can be a gifted person, a talented leader, a compassionate carer or an amazing speaker, but without godly character it all falls apart' (p.131)

Arwa Mahdawi investigates the qualities demonstrated by female leaders.


She asks the question: 'What can women in power teach all of us about leadership?'

LALOUX

Reinventing organisations (Nelson Parker, 2016)

Frederic Laloux explores and researches what it means to develop a new type of organisational management. 12 organisations against 45 different questions and criteria.

He states that something is broken in our organisations, and could we invent a whole new way of working.

He uses colours to describe how societies, clubs, churches, workplaces, companies are currently organised: Red, Amber, Orange, Green....and highlights the issues within the description.

He suggests a new model is emerging, and outlines some of the characteristics, calling it by a new colour TEAL.
